Import Information

- All students registering are to go to the UWF Student Center in Building 2 where they will receive their registration packet.
- Returning CLL students will receive a pre-printed yellow registration form complete with the students name and contact information. Please review this information and correct as needed.
- New CLL students will receive a blank white registration form. Please complete the form with your name and contact information. Please write legibly. CLL student contact information is private and is not shared with any other organizations or persons.
- Each student may sign up for four (4) classes for the \$60 membership fee. We accept cash or checks, only. Please make your check out to CLL, Inc. Additional classes over 4 are \$10 each.
- Classes listed in the catalog with a \$ sign indicates an additional special supply fee. This fee is paid to the instructor at registration, through check or cash. *This fee is non-refundable, except for rental deposits.*

- Mark your four top class choices, and please have alternative classes in mind in case your first choice(s) is/are full.
- Groups of students will be directed to move to Room 126 in building 1 from the Student Center in building 2, as space becomes available and then called to the computer stations based on arrival order.
- Next stop is the class payment table and your verification enrollment form.
- Finally, move to the special supply fee station in the lobby, to pay class non-refundable supply/special fee (cash or check to the instructor) and get a UWF parking decal.

Regular Registration is Friday, January 4th 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM in building 1 and 2 at UWF Emerald Coast Campus. Arrive early for best selection.

Late Registration is Monday—Wednesday, January 7—9

Classes start on Monday, January 14, 2019, unless noted on your enrollment verification form. Most classes run for 8 consecutive weeks. The winter term ends March 8. Same day as the final follies.
